## Ana Alcolea



Ana Alcolea, born in Zaragoza, has been a teacher of Language and Literature for twenty-six years. She lives between Spain, Italy, and Norway. She collaborates with cultural magazines and Heraldo de Aragón. Her encounters with readers and her passion for promoting reading among the youth have led her to travel throughout Spain, as well as to Colombia, France, Italy, Andorra, Morocco, Norway, Germany, and the United States. Several of her books have been included in the prestigious annual list of the Fundación Cuatrogatos (and Las chicas de la 305 won its award in 2023) .In recognition of her literary career, she received the Premio Cervantes Chico 2016, as well as the Premio de las Letras Aragonesas 2019, the Premio Búho 2020, and the Premio de la Fundación José Antonio Labordeta 2021.
